SAMPLE COURSES

Introduction to Criminal Justice is a first -year course that surveys the criminal justice system past and present, focusing on three systems – police, prosecution, corrections, and examines important concepts and debates about criminal justice.

Research Methods in Criminal Justice is a second-year course that explores the principles, data sources, and research methods appropriate for criminal justice research.
